

# COLORADO HEALTHY SCHOOLS SMART SOURCE

Research shows that healthy students are better learners. Collecting data is a critical part of creating healthier schools and supporting education improvement goals. Much of the focus — understandably so — is on collecting student achievement data such as test scores. Additional information related to physical activity, health education, student supports, and social and emotional wellness can have a significant impact on those achievement scores, but they often are not emphasized.

What's more, Colorado schools and districts have been inundated with requests to participate in data collection efforts about school health policies and practices. However, data are either not provided back to schools or are not available in a format that helps them make effective programmatic and policy decisions.

## WHAT IS SMART SOURCE?

Colorado Health Schools Smart Source (Smart Source) will streamline data about school health policies and practices into a statewide system by 2017. Smart Source is completely voluntary and no personally identifiable information will be collected on any student. The benefits of Smart Source include:

- For schools and districts, this resource will decrease duplicative data collection by streamlining multiple survey efforts and recognize exemplar schools and districts in order to replicate best practices. It will also provide a far more robust picture of the effects of their school health efforts through tailored technical assistance and school-level reports.
- For statewide funders, organizations, and agencies, it will help assess whether they are "moving the needle" on health and wellness in schools, allocate resources, and inform statewide decisions and legislation.

A school and district-level tool that collects data about health policies and practices.	A student-level tool that collects data on student attitudes and behaviors. Student-level data is collected via the Healthy Kids Colorado Survey.
A system that allows schools and districts to assess their own policy and practices in order to improve school health.	A monitoring system holding schools accountable for implementing school health policies and practices.
A tool that reduces the burden on schools by stream- lining multiple school health policy and practice data collections into one system.	One of many school-level tools that assess school health policy and practice.
A vehicle to help secure funding and resources to improve school health.	A vehicle to highlight schools and districts that are not engaged in health and wellness efforts.
An opportunity to recognize schools for the great work they do in health and wellness and replicate best practices.	An opportunity for schools and districts to be penalized for not emphasizing health and wellness efforts.
A way to provide reports to schools and districts with meaningful and actionable data.	A system that provides little to no usable data.

#### **PROJECT TIMELINE**

The development and roll-out of this data system will occur over a five-year period.

2013: Planning and Constructing

- Engage multiple stakeholders to identify data collection needs.
- Conduct scan of current data collection efforts and tools.
- Compile potential indicators and identify key outcomes that Smart Source will measure.

2014-2015: Piloting

- Develop indicators for use in pilot testing of the system with schools.
- · Test data collection system.
- Modify the system based on pilot participant feedback.

2016-2017: Implementation and Expansion

- · Launch Smart Source statewide.
- Enable all districts to collect school health policy and practice data.
- · Leverage results to promote and sustain healthy school programming.
